ORGANIC WASTE

Weekly collection every Tuesday, as of 7 a.m.

Kitchen waste

Fruits and vegetables
Bread, pasta, cereal products
Dairy products
Coffee grounds and tea bags
Eggs and eggshells
Meat and poultry (including bones)
Fish and seafood
Nuts and nutshells
Baking ingredients, herbs, spices
Chips, popcorn
Condiments and jams
Cooking oil, butter, lard, margarine
Salad dressing and sauces

Yard waste

Plants and weeds
Leaves, thatch and mulch
Twigs and small shrub branches
Hedge trimmings
Grass clippings

Other accepted waste

Soiled papers, newspapers and cardboard
Paper towels and tissues
Non-plasticized food packaging (e.g. sugar, flour and potato paper bags)
Animal food
Non-waxed paper plates
Muffin wrappers
Floor sweepings, vacuum bags
Cold ashes



RECYCLING

Weekly collection every Friday, as of 7 a.m.

Paper and cardboard

Newspaper, circulars, magazines
Books and telephone directories
Paper, envelopes, paper bags
Egg cartons
Cardboard rolls
Non-metallic wrapping paper
Milk and juice cartons

Plastic

All plastic containers identified with codes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7
Soft drink bottles
Water bottles
Plant pots
Plastic grocery bags
Product packaging
Plastic bags (Milk bags and pouches, frozen vegetables bags, bread bags, sandwich bags, dry cleaning bags)

Glass

All glass containers of any color

Métal

Cans
Soft-drink cans
Aluminum foil and plates
Lids and seals
Metal objects (weight less than 2.2 kg, volume less than 4 L)



GARBAGE

Weekly collection every Friday, as of 7 a.m.

Diapers and sanitary products
Soiled pet litter
Waxed paper (e.g.: ice cream container)
Waxed paper wrappings from meat or cheese
Dental floss
Plastic (code 6)
Dryer lint
Wood and ceramics
Porcelain and pottery
Styrofoam
Garden hose
Mirrors
Dishes
Electric light bulbs
Pressurized containers – non toxic



BULK PICK-UP

Free collection periods for one month in the spring and one month in the fall.

Furniture and appliances
Carpets and mattresses
Pool covers
Hot-water tanks

Construction scrap material (planks, gyproc, rocks, earth, concrete, etc., except for asphalt and asphalt roofing shingles)

Weekly rounds starting at 7 a.m. on Monday mornings. For service outside the free pick up periods, submit your request online via our iCARE system or call 514 630-2727. An estimate of applicable fees will be provided (\$25 to \$150).

BRANCHES

Free branch pick-up for two months in the spring and two months in the fall. Place your branches at the curb before 7 a.m. Monday mornings so as not miss the weekly rounds. Be sure to put them with the trunk towards the road. For service outside the free pick up periods, submit your request online via our iCARE system or call 514 630-2727. An estimate of applicable fees will be provided (\$25 to \$150).

Hazardous waste

Two collections a year are held in Kirkland, one in spring and one in late summer.

Dispose of:

Paint, acids, aerosols
Used oil, glue, Solvents and removers
Cleaning products
Pesticides
Cells and batteries
Computer equipment



Bulk items

You may transport bulk items yourself and drop them off at the Municipal Garage, for a fee of \$10.

Electronics

Electronic equipment can be dropped off at any time in the large bin located in the parking lot at Public Works.

Batteries

Used batteries can be deposited in the designated containers at Town Hall, Public Works, Library and Sports Complex.



Ink cartridges

Drop them off in the marked bins at Town Hall and the municipal Library.
